Unique in all the world, there is no other town with the name Culpeper. With an amazing collection of unique shops, exceptional restaurants, and small-town charm, Culpeper lies at the heart of the Piedmont. Find gourmet chocolates, organic meats and produce, country ham, and fresh baked goods all within a few blocks. Take a Wine & Moonshine tour at our wineries or at the only legal moonshine distillery in the state - Belmont Farm! See how'shine is made and hear stories of the owner's grandfather, whose secret family recipe is still used today.



Live the history that surrounds us here on the Civil War battlefields of Kelly's Ford, Cedar Mountain, and Brandy Station, where the largest cavalry battle in the western hemisphere was fought in 1863. See the Graffiti House where the charcoal writings and drawings left by both Union & Confederate soldiers were hidden for more than a century. Follow in some very large footprints at the Museum of Culpeper History, where a set of 215 million year old dinosaur tracks found in a local quarry are displayed and an entire gallery interprets the Civil War in Culpeper. History of a more modern kind lives on at the Library of Congress National Audio-Visual Conservation Center. In addition to collecting, preserving and restoring all of America's film & audio history, the NAVCC makes that history accessible by offering free screenings of classic movies and silent films with live music. It's a unique chance to see these great films on the big screen - as they were meant to be seen!

Visit Culpeper soon, where you'll see that we are Still Making History. With so much to see and do, you'll make some history of your own. They say you will travel back in time in Madison County... and you do.

Madison County, formed in 1792, was named for the family of future president James Madison. In character and feeling, the County has changed little since the day it was created. With rolling hills and valleys producing beef, dairy products and grains, agriculture reigns supreme. Orchards climb the steeper slopes and the lush vineyards at Prince Michel, Sweely Estate, Castle Gruen and Brightwood Vineyard and Farm welcome visitors. Bounded on the west by the Shenandoah National Park, adventurers can hike along the Skyline Drive and the Appalachian Trail. Climb to the top of 3,268-foot-high Old Rag Mountain for breathtaking views of Virginia's Piedmont!

The Civil War still echoes at the sites of the Battle of James City and the Battle of Jack's Shop and throughout the countryside still dotted with antebellum homes along the old Blue Ridge Turnpike (Route 231). Every Labor Day weekend, enjoy a Taste of the Mountains, a heritage festival that celebrates 18th & 19th century life with vendors displaying handmade crafts, music, and entertainment for kids, too. Listen to the sounds of the mountains at a blue grass festival at Graves' Mountain Lodge or take in a Music on the Lawn concert under the summer sky. No matter what time of year, there's always something to look forward to in Madison.

Known for its scenic beauty, agriculture and cultural delights, Rappahannock County lies in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains adjoining Shenandoah National Park. With a population of only 7,000 people, Rappahannock is a rural oasis with no traffic lights, fast food or "big box" stores. While cell phone service may be sparse, the lifestyle enjoyed by County residents is both modern and connected.

Historically agricultural and with a strong commitment to land conservation, Rappahannock County has remained pristine and is described by many as "a scenic masterpiece made perfect by nature." The landscape of Rappahannock is speckled with award-winning wineries and a distillery, orchards and farms, cozy country inns, B&Bs and cottages, and art and antique galleries. Visitors may enjoy the performing arts at the Theatre at Washington and at the RAAC Community Theatre in the Town of Washington, and at the Theatre House at Castleton Farms, home of Maestro Lorin and Dietlinde Maazel. For over five decades, Maestro Maazel has been one of the world's most esteemed and sought-after conductors.

The Town of Washington, with a population of fewer than 200 people, has never outgrown the five-block by two-block grid that George Washington laid out when he surveyed the town in 1749 at the age of 17. It is home to the world famous, five-star The Inn at Little Washington with renowned Chef Patrick O'Connell. The village of Sperryville offers art and antique galleries, restaurants, a distillery, and even a coffee roaster, all at the gateway to Shenandoah National Park. The village of Flint Hill is a favorite among bikers, hikers and runners. The ideal terrain and spectacular views make for a great starting point for the annual Fodderstack 10K race. Along with its neighboring counties, Rappahannock offers "Something Special in the Foothills."
